- 4) Secretary – Reading/accepting of minutes from last KCAG meeting. Minutes were accepted
- 5) Reports:
 - a) President - DJ Hall reports on an NCRC event in Perryville, MO last month. They used Berome-Moore Cave for the event.
 - b) Treasurer Report – Pic Walenta reports a balance of \$2231.11 in our bank account. DJ Hall motioned that we need to appropriate approx. \$100 to Jim Cooley in order to build a wooden box for the Grotto's camp stove. A motion was made and it was passed unanimously.
 - c) Quarter Master Report - Pic Walenta reports that she, Jim Cooley and have most of the equipment. DJ Hall has some other equipment. Gary Johnson mentioned he needed to borrow the survey equipment from DJ Hall
 - d) MSS Report – Jim Cooley gave out flyers from MSS, explained the basis of their organization, and asked each of us to consider membership.
 - e) CCC Report – Bill Gee reports they had a bat census trip. They also found that there was another recent large water level spike according to the water level data loggers.

 - a) Novice Trip – Austen Peters reported on a recent trip to Skaggs Cave near Waynesville. Twelve people attended and seven were novices.
 - b) Cleveland Cave Restoration – Dave Mead not present. Jim Cooley said Dave spent last Sunday scrubbing the cave walls. Lee Krout was there last Sunday with Jim to finish some survey work.
 - c) Hickory County - Gary Johnson reports that the landowner trip took place last weekend and was successful. Shelly Colatskie attended and took samples from bats and studied

the guano pile (estimate of 14,000 bats). Gary said there would be more survey and bushwhacking trips in December.

- d) Fund Raising – Pic Walenta reports she is working on a Grotto calendar. She has obtained a Springfield Grotto Calendar and is looking for any ideas. There will be a photo shoot this weekend dedicated to the calendar. (Secretary's note: this trip was later postponed due to the fact the Carroll Cave Landowner does not want cavers on the property on the opening day of rifle season). Her goal is to have them ready this December. Rick Hines said he used Costco's online program for creating the calendar. Pic brought Grotto apparel.
 - e) Cloud Nine – Lee Krout says there may be a bat census in February. He believes they are 80% complete with the survey.

 - l) Missouri White Nose – Jim Cooley says Shannon County is now suspect for WNS contamination due to recent positive swab tests. This may be the winter that WNS takes its toll and many bats could be wiped out.

- 7) Member Cave Trip Reports

a) Jim Cooley - The last three weekends he has been doing conservation trips in Oregon and Shannon County, including a visit on October 26th to Big Mouth Cave (ORE-002), arrangements for which were made by local cooperator and CRF Joint Venturer Derrick Norris. This cave has never been surveyed and Jim wants to do that this winter. He also visited Boulder Skylight Arch Cave on October 27th, on the Mark Twain National Forest, also reported by Derrick Norris who discovered it while deer hunting. And he led a trip to Wind Cave November 2nd, on ONSR, to measure the guano piles. Then on Monday November 4th, Jim and Mark Phillips floated the Current River to monitor caves including Poker, Merritt Rock, Blue Pearl, Conglomerate.

b) Jim Cooley - Cleveland Cave's existing gate has been breached and needs to be repaired in order to protect the good conservation work that Dave Mead and others have accomplished up to this point. The existing gate is not bat friendly so Jim has designed one that is bat friendly, and showed us a drawing and materials list. The gate would require approx. 2955 lbs of steel and based on 2011 prices, would cost around \$1884.00. There is leftover steel from the Berome Moore cave gate project, and he will be inquiring about that. Jim will be asking the Grotto for funds as soon as he figures out what material is available. He has also asked MCKC to see if they can provide assistance. Jim has targeted April 2014 for the Cleveland Cave gate building. Vic Nickel owns Cleveland Cave, and will most likely be selling it in the next four to six years.
