Minutes of the Kansas City Area Grotto March 2023 Business Meeting

Blue Spring Cave: Corey Ellis gave a wonderful presentation on the history of Blue Springs Cave. This cave is in White County, Tennessee. White County has the most caves of any county in Tennessee (1,000+). Blue Springs Cave is by far the longest, with a current length of 40 miles, and still growing. Corey sourced a great deal of the history from a book called "Blue Spring Cave" by Larry Matthews and Bill Walter. Blue Springs Cave is under the TN Cumberland Plateau and passes 800 ft below a lake. Corey will be presenting part two of this cave in April's meeting.
