Minutes of the Kansas City Area Grotto November 2024 Business Meeting Tuesday, November 19th, 2024 – 6:30 to 8:30 P.M.

Island Cave: Ha Ha Tonka State Park: Dillon Bond gave the grotto a presentation about his recent trip to Island Cave, which is located in Ha Ha Tonka State Park in Camden County, Missouri. This cave is one of the first few that was publicly documented in Missouri. This cave is open by permit application from June 15th to September 15th. Dillon showed various photographs of the formations along the passages. After talking about Island Cave, he transitioned to showing pictures of his September Bio-Inventory trip to Kiesewetter Cave. He highly recommended those who have not had a chance to visit, to put it into their calendars.
